The Montgomery Room is coming! Thanks to the generosity of the family and friends of A. C. Montgomery, we will soon have additional display space in the museum. We have been bursting at the seams with valuable historical items which could not be displayed in the existing space. With the funds provided to honor A. C., we are able to convert a storage room into a brand new space devoted to the ongoing history of Hilliard as we move forward in time. Many of the memories that we have all made in the last 50 years...and into the future...will be displayed in the new space. Additionally, there will be opportunities to display visiting or rotating displays. Watch for an announcement of the grand opening.

Take a look at Weaver Park!! Hilliard Rotary, with the help from a grant (proposal written by their member Christy Clark) has provided five new park benches to the Village area. This represents a sizeable investment in the community and the benches will provide durable and comfortable seating to visitors.

The Voting Booth now has individual booths since curtains were recently made. It also includes historical displays and more will be added that depict the history of voting in the USA and in particular in the Hilliard area. It is now open to all when we have tours in the Village.
