Winter In The Village

For all Members and Friends of the Society

I feel the need to remind you that the Society is a private organization with no support from the City in terms of funding. For many years, the Society was able to exist by using funds from a major bequest of a deceased member. Subsequently, we were fortunate to receive City of Hilliard grants for a few years to help us maintain the buildings that have been entrusted to us, but City Policies have changed. I must ask all our members, especially those who purchased life memberships years ago, to consider their commitment to

keeping this special community asset viable.

We depend on income from tours, weddings, profits from food sales at events, donations to our collection boxes to pay insurance, utilities, mechanicals maintenance and office supplies. In a separate article, I have listed some special donations received since last newsletter. In every case those donations were designated for a special purpose. When capital maintenance is required we no longer have resources.

With the arrival of winter, the Village with the Train Station and the Caboose depicts a special feeling of the dedication and preservation of the History of the greater Hilliard area that we are accomplishing in this special Historical Village, which is the cornerstone of the Hilliard Ohio Historical Society.

Encourage everyone you know to just take a ride through, stop for a look and enjoy this very special landmark Village.

President Message - Continued

Needs for this year include: replacing the roof of the school house (about \$11,000), painting and roof repair of the barn (about \$2,500), renovation of two bathrooms to meet ADA standards as well as a quarter century of wear and tear (about \$16,500), updating museum security and displays including putting in place the standard practices for archiving and preservation of period articles and materials (\$4,000).

I encourage each of you to consider how you might help the Society in its efforts to retain this Village as a private society and contribution to the community. Your help could come in terms of cash donations, pledges to sponsor all or part of one of the above projects, recruitment of others to become part of the support of the Society's Mission, or volunteering your time and muscle to help decrease the monetary cost of a project.

New Construction Coming to the Village

This new project will begin groundbreaking in February 2019. Norwich Township will build a new **Covered Pavilion**, near our village in Weaver Park. They will donate it to the City and we (our Society), will have the planning and booking responsibilities. This will generate new income for our Society from these rental opportunities.

The Pavilion will be located on the land behind our Colwell Church in Weaver Park. More details to come on this exciting addition to our Village as more details develop.

News From the Archival Library

Looking Back, looking forward like others, the Library Archives staff have been looking at the past year and what we have accomplished. In April, we started keeping a record of our reference questions. It proved to be interesting. Our questions came to us from the Historical Society webpage (12), phone calls (7) and people who came to the Archives (7). I think that it shows that the webpage is increasing the visibility of the society.

One other accomplishment was that Kari Inglis completed a comprehensive review of the book catalog which is a spreadsheet. It is now correct and up to date. We have a print out at the Archives which we can use to help people find materials.

Our goals for the coming year include completing the land abstract project. All the surveys have been transcribed by Jenny Spring Starr and I am presently cataloging them for use. Jim and Marge Dougherty are helping identify photographs of Hilliard and helping us with their history. These will be put in notebooks for reference use. We have started organizing the gift of materials that Jane Smith gave us. This contains historical material from the Anson Smith Family. We will not run out of things to do as we have "put on the back burner" several projects which we want to get back to soon. 2019 promises to be a very busy year.
