<u>LIBRARY NEWS</u> – Marilyn Evans I serve as the archivist or Historical Librarian for Historical Society. My primary job is to help preserve the written history of Hilliard. Most of the Job consists of cataloging and organizing the written documents we receive. We try to limit our collection to those materials that primarily deal with Hilliard and nearby areas. In addition, we answer questions about the history of this area. Our questions come from people who visit, phone calls or visits on our website. It's an interesting range of questions and the fun of the job is trying to find answers for everyone. We refer them to other libraries or historical collections when we cannot answer the questions here. In addition, I serve on the Board of the Historical society which is the decision making arm of the Society. We meet about 6 times a year. I also serve on committees when asked.

We keep our Library during summer concerts when the Hilliard Arts Council has their concerts at the SBC pavilion on Norwich Street.

I enjoy my work but would like to see more Society Members volunteer so we can keep our archives open more hours.
